- Devices and high-speed internet access in the campus ensures equitable participation in digital learning.

- Collaborations with businesses, non-profits, government entities, and other community stakeholders to provide real-world learning experiences are undertaken by departments as interactive sessions and invited lectures.
- Teachers and community facilitators who are skilled in integrating real-world community issues into the curriculum are made available in the campus.
- Parental engagement is also ensured in the campus activities
- The institution in keeping with the curriculum encourages learning through projects that have direct, positive effects on the local community, such as environmental conservation, public health initiatives, or social justice efforts.






Visiting Govt. Mental Hospital, Kuthiravattoom

WORLD AIDS DAY

ENVIRONMENT CONSERVATION INITIATIVES

This initiative is part of a long-term effort to clean the Wayanad-Thamarasseri Pass, a significant tourist destination in Kerala. A total of fifteen volunteers and one programme officer participated in the event. They cleaned HP6 to HP8 of Wayanad-Thamarasseri Pass.






Skill Development Programs

Extension activities are an integral part of our college's commitment to community engagement and development. The Dept of Chemistry conducted a soap-making extension activity for kudumbasree members and COK volunteers. The primary objective of this extension activity was to empower and train kudumbasree members in a new skill and thereby promote entrepreneurship and self-reliance among women.

The Soap making workshop was held on 25-02-2023 at Govt. College Mokeri. The participants included 20 kudumbasree members. In addition, training was given to students from other departments and COK volunteers. Hands-on demonstration of soap making was given by faculties from the chemistry department. Participants learned the art of soap making, which could serve as a source of income for them. Kudumbasree members expressed their interest in continuing soap making as a small-scale business. The soaps which were made during the programme were distributed among the college students and faculties.



Preparation of awareness posters (spreadof Nipah Virus)

Spread of Nipah virus was rampant in the district of Kozhikode especially in and around Kuttiadi which is adjacent to Mokeri. Educational institutions were closed down for more than aweek to curb the spread of the deadly virus. To create awareness on the need to stay at home to prevent the spread of the virus, the students were asked to create awareness posters. It helped to boost the morale of the students to face the crisis with a positive mindset. Awareness posters were circulated via what sapp messages to keep away growing fear in the minds of the learners regarding the fast spread of the Nipah Virus. The need for staying indoors was reiterated through the poster made and students were encouraged to get back in full form in their online classes. An online meeting was convened and decisions pertaining to preparation of the poster were taken. The design of the poster was also finalised.



Service During Covid- 19 Pandemic

Both teachers and students of the college rose to the occasion, demonstrating extraordinary commitment to serving the community in various capacities. Understanding the gravity of the crisis, they engaged in numerous initiatives to provide relief and support to those affected. Students actively participated in distributing essential supplies such as masks, sanitizers, food, and medicines to underprivileged sections of society. Many students volunteered with local organizations and NGOs, assisting in relief operations, organizing vaccination drives, and helping in isolation centers. In response to the critical need for strict enforcement of COVID-19 safety protocols, several teachers from the college were appointed as sectoral magistrates during the pandemic. This important role placed them at the forefront of ensuring public compliance with health guidelines designed to curb the spread of the virus. They were actively involved in overseeing public areas such as markets, public roads and residential zones to ensure adherence to COVID-19 safety measures, including social distancing, maskwearing, and crowd control.

PROCEEDINGS OF THE CHAIRMAN, DISATER MANAGEMENT AUTHORITY& DISTRICT COLLECTOR, KOZHIKODE (Present: Dr.Narasimhugari T.L Reddy I A S)

Sub: Covid19 Pandemic - Imminent/ Possible surge - Reinvigorating enforcement-Appointing Gazetted Officers of various Departments as Sector Magistrates & Covid Sentinels in Police Station - Orders issued.

Ref: 1. G.O(Rt)No. 10/2021/DMD Dt: 04/01/2021

2. G.O(Rt)No. 564/2021/DMD Dated 4/8/2021

3. Go(RT)No:564/2021 dated, 04/08/2021

ORDER No. DCKKD/4959/2021-F4 Dated: 05-08-2021

It is observed that Covid-19 cases in Kozhikode District are shooting up with more cases per day. Strict control measures are needed for containing the spread of disease as the health care systems struggling to keep up with the surge. In this scenario, to prevent an outbreak and to provide better treatment facilities to people and to contain the disease, regulations have to be introduced and failing which it will lead to a major community spread and collapse of health care systems which will have disastrous aftermath.

As per reference cited, Government authorized the DDMAs to depute Sector Magistrates & Covid Sentinels in the district .

In this scenario, to prevent a major community outbreak which will seriously endanger human lives I, Narasimhugari T L Reddy, District Magistrate and District Collector Kozhikode, hereby depute the officials & teachers (annexure list appended) as sector Magistrates & Covid Sentinels under section 26,33& 39 of the Disaster management act 2005, in addition to the officers posted as per reference 2nd cited.

These officers should reinvigorate monitoring and enforcement of Covid containment activities in their jurisdiction along with their important official duties as follows:

- They shall be officers of the DDMAs reporting directly to the Chaiman, DDMA.
 Among other things, they shall act as the 'eyes and ears' of the DDMA for better containment of the pandemic. These officers shall report to the Chairman, DDMA in the manner and frequency desired by the DDMA.
- The jurisdiction of these officers is shown in the annexure list.

- These Sector Magistrates shall liaise and work alongside the personnel already deployed from other regular departments to enforce that the directions of Government and of DDMA are enforced in letter and spirit. They shall be nonpartisan in their actions. They shall work in unison with senior officers of other departments with the common objective of containment of the pandemic in their mind.
- These officers shall focus on Break the Chain campaign(SMS- Social distancing, mask, sanitizing), quarantine and isolation, compliance of Covid protocol in gathering(in marriages/ funerals/ auditorium/ others), Containment measures, compliance of Covid protocol in shops, markets and commercial establishments, IEC campaigns and such other matters as advised by the District Development Commissioner and Chairperson DDMA.
- · All the Sector magistrates should report offences in the Covid-19 Jagratha Portal .
- These Sector Magistrates should carry out the duties and responsibilities entrusted by each Taluk incident commanders.
- They should ensure the implementation of every regulations & prohibitory orders issued from time to time by the District Collector & Chairman.
- · They should be well versed with COVID -Jagratha portal.
- They are empowered to take action against any violations of any Covid Containment measures. For imposing fine, they should report the offence in Jagratha Portal (Report Offence)
- They should ensure that the perimeter of all harbours, markets and crowded towns and containment Zones strictly be manned by police.
- They should ensure that QRTs and police visit the crowded areas and take necessary steps for the containment of disease in areas under their command.
- The Sector Magistrates shall be provided with the list of all gatherings (marriages, funerals, religious, social, political etc) in their jurisdiction and shall strictly enforce Covid Protocol in these gatherings. The SHOs should provide police assistance as and when required.
- These officers can organize their parent departmental team and resources to enable him to carry out his functions.
- These officers can carry out any unavoidable important duties of their parent department as when required.
- Each Sector magistrate should meet the Secretary of the concerned LSGI &
 Medical officer to get a clear picture about the Surge if any in the area.

Responsibilities of other concerned officers

- All the secretaries of the Local Self Government Institutions should provide proper data regarding the covid cases under their jurisdiction to the Sector magistrates.
- All the four Tahsildars are hereby authorized to hire sufficient vehicles for the Sector magistrates. The expenses will be met from SDRF. The Tahsildars should ensure that vehicles are hired at a minimum cost.
- This Vehicle should be used only for the official purpose of Sector Magistrate. None
 of the sector magistrate is allowed to use the vehicles allotted to them for any
 personal purpose
- It is the responsibility of the Tahsildar to ensure that the Vehicle ahould have a
 prominent board citing that it is of Sector magistrate.
- The District Development Officer Should review the performance of the Sector Magistrates & Incident Commanders should monitor their duties.

These officers should be on duty from 07-08-2021 onwards

Outcomes of Extension Activities in the neighbourhood community in terms of impact and sensitizing the students to social issues for their holistic development during 2019-2024

The extension and community intervention activities of the college cater to various needs within the community, addressing important social challenges and nurturing a deep sense of social responsibility in the students. The college has committed to the holistic development and betterment of the marginalised sections of the local community. The college prioritizes the effective implementation of extension programs, sensitises the students about their social responsibilities and ensures that students are made aware of their social responsibilities through the active involvement of selected committees, which are led by both student leaders and teachers. Such activities provide the students with relevant learning experiences as well as contribute significantly to the welfare of the community.

Various organisations and departments of the college have partnered with local institutions and NGOs to meet the students' and community needs effectively. The Department of English has conducted extension activities during the academic year 2018 to 2023 collaborating with local govt schools and unaided colleges. The programmes focused not only on enhancing the language skills and interactive skills of the students, but also on their creative skills and critical thinking. The Department of Chemistry has organised a programme called School@Lab, where the students of teachers from nearby schools visited the chemistry and physics labs of the college. This initiative aimed to ignite curiosity and deepen participants' understanding of scientific subjects.

The institution continues to ensure the participation of students in community development programs through projects initiated by organisations like National Service Scheme and Campuses of Kozhikode (COK). The NSS unit of the college has adopted a local village and support their potters' community. They also conduct health awareness camps, health-check-ups and blood donation camps in collaboration with local NGOS and health department to spread the importance of good health and proper hygiene. The NSS has also helped two former students of the college to build houses using funds raised by volunteers. Environmental clean-up drives and flood relief activities are some of the other activities undertaken by NSS. The volunteers of COK has made visits to \mental health centre, old age homes and provided for the needy. The students also involve in skill enhancement activities like LED bulb making, soap making, paper pen and paper booklet making.

The faculty of the college has played a key role in supporting the community as well. Faculty members from the Department of English have appeared on All India Radio in Kozhikode, delivering educational talks on topics such as the benefits of reading, drug abuse, artificial intelligence, and women's harassment. Many faculty members have also served as sectoral magistrates during the pandemic, contributing to the welfare of the broader community during a time of crisis. Through these diverse initiatives, the college continues to prioritize active student involvement in community service and outreach, ensuring that both students and faculty play a vital role in improving society.

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
